PRESENTATION REGARDING ORDINANCE 633-2024- LEWIS CONLEY, PLANNER-CONSOLIDATED LAND USE BOARD

(Tonetta) Gave overview of the history of the ordinance. (Conley) Testified to the ordinance content and necessity of zoning change.

SECOND READING AND ADOPTON: ORDINANCE 633-2024 BY TITLE ONLY: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 606-2022, AS AMENDED, CHAPTER 26, SECTION 26-4.12, ENTITLED LIGHT INDUSTRIAL MANUFACTURING (LIM), SO AS TO REMOVE ASPHALT MANUFACTURING FACILITIES AS A PERMITTED USE THEREIN, TO SET FORTH ASPHALT AND CONCRETE MANUFACTURING FACILITIES AS CONDITIONAL USES IN THE LIGHT INDUSTRIAL ZONE AND SET STANDARDS THEREFORE AND TO CHANGE THE BOUNDARIES OF THE LIGHT INDUSTRIAL ZONE BY THE ADDITION OF CERTAIN LOTS THERETO

PUBLIC HEARING ORDINANCE 633-2024

Mayor Pikolycky opened the Public Hearing on Ordinance 633-2024. Members of the public commented.

Kristen Sorensen-1356 De Hirsch- Asked council to keep the zoning as R-1 rather than changing to Light Industrial. Commented adjacent lots are residential.

Matthew Hoke- 14 Pacific- Ocean World residents would like to keep the lots zoned as residential. Asked about the acreage of the contiguous lots.

Jane Player- 151 Fidler Hill – Asked if she could make a motion to amend the ordinance to increase the amount of acreage needed as a buffer.

Andrew Haley- 1285 Friedrichstadt- Questioned the buffer area if a large industrial plant is approved.

47 Dogwood- Expressed that people will want to develop lots in question and keep it the zoning residential.

Mike Micalonis- Ocean World VP- Expressed that residents of Ocean World are opposed to ordinance. Asked if borough has the intent of selling the properties.

Walt- 252 Oak St- Requested the area left as residential.

Susan Peretta- Site 16 Ocean World- Questioned what would be allowed in the zone and what reporting is concerned.

Marie Dempsey- Ivy St- Questioned the amount of acreage in each of the lots.

Kelly- Ivy St- Asked prohibiting any building on that area

Susan Walker- 1285 Friedrichstadt- Questioned how long it would take to sell municipal property.

George Sherby- De Hirsch Ave- Commented that the Borough is staying ahead of a potential property.

Hagenbush- 69 Pacific- Questioned that the Borough's intent to sell the property for tax revenue.

Councilman David Bennet- Commented on his experience in working on the Master Plan and the process of determining the zoning for the area.

David Hoak-Ocean World- Ocean World taxpayers do not want the zoning change.

Mayor Pikolycky- Commented on decisions being made by council for the best interest of the community.

Council President Ortiz- Commented on council abiding by the rules and working for the good of the community.
